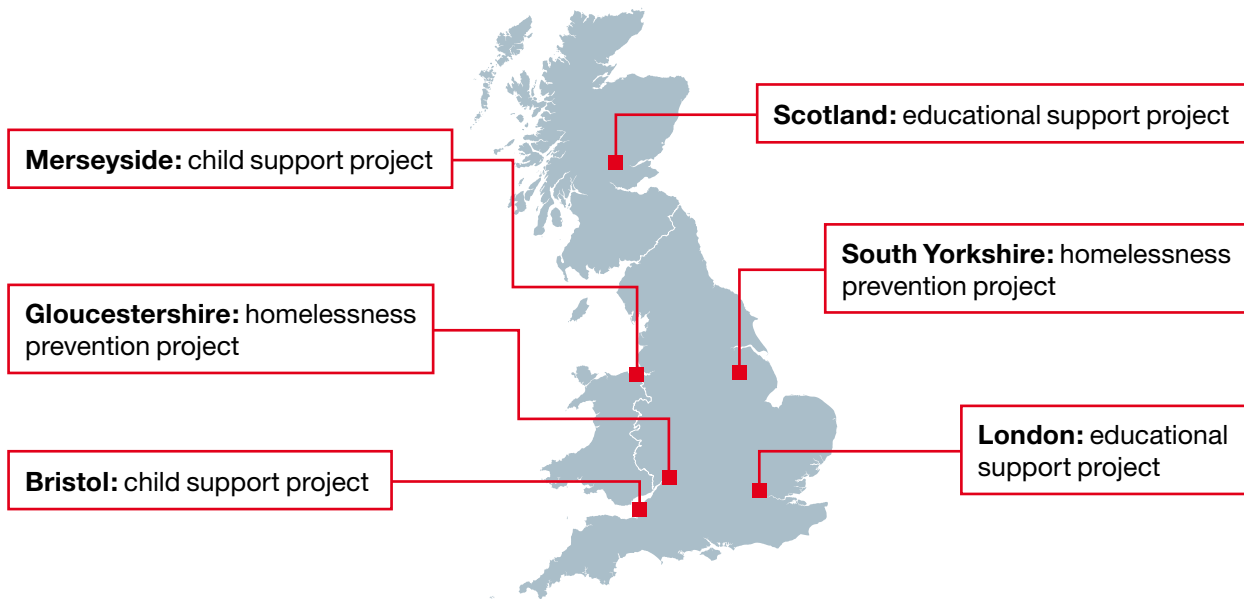


Who will benefit and where



In addition to the six projects above, we will provide: expert housing advice through Children's Centres and via a helpline; a team of lawyers who will represent families; and a team of policy co-ordinators who will champion policy and practice that benefits homeless children everywhere.

Bristol project beneficiaries (900 total)

- 900 children's needs are assessed
- 600 of these receive child support plans and specialist help
- 225 of these receive intensive support.

Merseyside project beneficiaries (600 total)

- 600 children's needs are assessed
- 480 of these receive child support plans and specialist help
- 120 of these receive intensive support.

London project beneficiaries (450 total)

- 450 children receive educational support, advice and advocacy
- 120 of these receive intensive support.

Gloucestershire project beneficiaries (6,020 total)

- 6,000 young people are educated
- 120 of these participate in peer support sessions
- 20 Peer Educators achieve qualifications.

South Yorkshire peer education project beneficiaries (1,015 total)

- 1,000 young people are educated
- 400 of these receive tailored support plans
- 15 Peer Educators achieve qualifications.

Scottish project beneficiaries (900 total)

- 560 children receive educational support
- 245 children receive homework support
- 95 children receive home care support.

Legal service beneficiaries (396 total)

- 396 children are successfully represented.

Housing advice services to families and young people (14,543 total)

- 6,750 children will benefit from housing advice from our caseworkers to prevent or resolve homelessness
- 7,793 families and young people receive assistance through our free housing advice helpline.

Total direct beneficiaries: 24,824
